## *St Peter's Cirencester and St Michael's Tetbury celebrate the Silver Jubilee of Priestly Ordination of Father Philip Mansell Thomas*



*12<sup>th</sup> July 1996 – 12<sup>th</sup> July 2021*

Father Philip was born in Hillingdon, Middlesex, London in 1959; however, he considers himself a 'Welshman', because his mother just could not get home in time! Father, grew up locally in the parish of Chipping Camden attending Chipping Camden School, followed by Durham University studying General Arts (French, German and Medieval History).

The first thoughts he had to join the priesthood were after the Easter Vigil at the former seminary in Ushaw, Durham. At the time he was a member of the Church of England and sought to answer that vocation there. After spending 18 months working in England and Australia working with the Missions of Seamen (The Flying Angel Clubs), he commenced his training at the Theological College in Chichester, the first such college in England and now closed. He was then ordained as an Anglican priest in 1987 in Bolton. He worked in the Anglican diocese of Manchester, first in Wythenshawe and then in Leigh, Lancs. Both churches are now closed.

His personal pilgrimage began to draw him closer to the Apostolic See, whilst he reflected on the issues of authority and decision making, surrounding proposed changes in the C. of E. Accordingly, Father wrote to the Bishop of Clifton, the Late Bishop Mervyn Alexander about how he felt

and also had talks with Downside Abbey monks and was then received into Catholic Unity at the Abbey on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> December 1993.

The desire and vocation to serve as a priest were still present and he was accepted by the Clifton Diocese. Bishop Mervyn asked him to complete his preparations for the priesthood for two years at the Beda College, Rome. Arriving home, Father became a priest on 12<sup>th</sup> July 1996 at Downside Abbey, along with Frs. Michael Fountaine and Ian McCarthy.



Father's first appointment for 2 years was as a curate was in Salisbury, at St Osmund's and later also Most Holy Redeemer, under Canon T.R. Atthill. He became a PP for this first time at St Thomas More's in Marlborough, where Fr. John Blacker now serves (a predecessor in Cirencester!). After 10yrs there [and without closing the church!] he then moved to Somerset as Parish Priest at SS Joseph and Theresa in Wells. Whilst there, he also looked after first St Michael's in Shepton Mallet and later Queen of the Apostles, Cheddar. For a while, therefore, Father was one of the cheesiest priests around!!! Father Philip was most recently moved by Bishop Declan to care for St Michael's Tetbury and St Peter's Cirencester in 2019.

It has been claimed, that, when Father first arrived, he came across as a whirlwind, trying to breathe fresh air and confidence into our two parishes, whilst being caring and easy to talk too. Some of this had to be put on hold, as the Pandemic gripped us all and initially church doors were locked.

Even then, in his own way, he attempted to show concern for parishioners, especially the sick and bereaved. Now that things are opening up once more, we hope that he will go one caring about his parishioners living and departed. He tries to preach helpful and informative homilies, which are not too long. He does not always succeed. His sense of humour rarely deserts him and he comes across as very knowledgeable, especially in the history of the Catholic Faith, our Holy Church and its wonderful saints. We hope that he will increase and enrich the knowledge and living of the Christian Faith.


He has implemented Pope Benedict XVI's motu proprio "Summorum Pontificum", giving parishioners of both St Michael's and St

Peters' access once again to Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, the 'Traditional Latin Mass'. All are warmly welcome!

On a lighter note, Father has a great voice, with a love of Gilbert and Sullivan; Rugby especially Wales ("and any team that beats England! He says); good food including cooking and many, many books!

With COVID restrictions, it has been a very difficult time for all of us and of course Fr Philip, who did not see anyone during the first lockdown. This difficult experience was also the lot of many other people and parishioners living alone. Father had been with us barely six months before we went into the first lockdown, followed by nearly eighteen months of restrictions, regulations and lockdowns. As we are about to come out of lockdown again, with many restrictions lifted, let us come together as a 'one parish' to support Father not just by attending Mass (which is very important), but by active participation in parish life.

We thank Father Philip for answering God's call to become a Catholic priest; for agreeing to Bishop Declan's request for him to become our parish priest. We promise to offer our prayers continually for him and to support him, as he deepens our faith and understanding, leading us forward as our priest and shepherd for many happy years. May God always bless you and keep you safe Father Philip.
