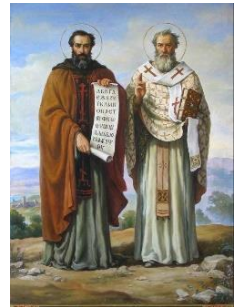

**THE -GESIMAS** Last Sunday marked “70 days to Easter’s primrose tide of praise. Septuagesima, Sexa- Quinqu- means Lent is near, which make you think.” This little verse by Sir John Betjeman makes the point about the approach of Lent. The word Septuagesima is the Latin for 70. Quadragesima is Latin for both Lent and for 40. The Season has 40 days, plus 6 Sundays.

**Holy Gospel: Matthew 5:17-37** *You have learnt how it was said to our ancestors; but I say this to you*

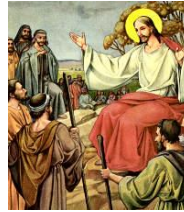
**Communion Antiphon** They ate and had their fill, and what they craved the Lord gave them; they were not disappointed in what they craved.
