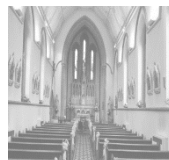
4th Apr. **First Sunday of Easter - The Resurrection of the Lord, start of the Great 50 Days.**

This discipline need not only include food, but may also include helping someone or praying the Stations of the Cross or the Rosary instead.

MASS TEXTS

Entrance Antiphon: **Be my protector, O God, a mighty stronghold to save me. For you are my rock, my stronghold! Lead me, guide me, for the sake of your name.**

Gloria Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you; we bless you; we adore you; we glorify you; we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most-High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

First Reading: Leviticus 13:1-2,44-46

Resp. Psalm. **You are my refuge, O Lord; you fill me with the joy of salvation.**

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1

Gospel Acclamation Alleluia, Alleluia! May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our mind, so that we can see what hope His call holds for us. Alleluia!

Gospel Mark 1:40-45

Apostles Creed: I believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there He will come and judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting. Amen.

Communion Antiphon: **They ate and had their fill, and what they craved the Lord gave them; they were not disappointed in what they craved.**

Act of Spiritual Communion Lord Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Holy Sacrament of the altar. I love You above all things, and I passionately desire to receive You into my soul. Since I do not now receive You sacramentally, come spiritually into my soul, so that I may unite myself wholly to You, now and forever. Amen.



THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK One of the most important things that those who met Him remembered about Jesus in His earthly lifetime was His attitude towards the sick of soul, mind and body. He was a Compassionate Healer and Friend of Sinners. They gossiped about His healing miracles on the Sabbath in the Synagogue and about those with whom He ate, tax collectors and prostitutes. This deep concern and care did not disappear with the Passion and Resurrection. As we face the start of Lent – Quadragesima, we too know that Christ is the Merciful Healer and Friend of Sinners.
