

THE PARABLE



Father Philip writes I remember doing a bible study once in a group, that was facilitated by an elderly monk. As you may know, Benedictine monks and nuns do a form of daily praying of the Bible called Lectio Divina. Many clergy and lay people do this as well. The monk had already gone over the scholarly background to the passage we were looking at. It was this Sunday's gospel, the Parable of the Sower. It is one of the most famous of all Jesus' stories. We went round the circle, saying what we thought the parable meant to us and for us. Some said they were stony ground (I didn't like to agree that they were hard hearted)! Others said they were overcome by the cares of this world (a feeling we all know sometimes). No one said they were the rich crop.

We hung upon what the old monk would say. He paused and shut his eyes for a moment and then he looked at us and said, "I am the entire field!" We were taken aback. Stunned, we said nothing. After a moment, the old monk asked us to think about what he had said. Parts of our lives are very Christian and the Faith flourishes, the crop bearing a hundredfold. Some parts of our lives are choked by the worries of this world, overcome by weeds. Parts of our lives have yet to be converted to the Faith, despite hearing the Gospel message, like the path where birds ate the seed. Some parts of our lives are stony ground, where the Faith takes only shallow root and withers when the sun of difficulty shines down. More watering and manuring is needed to make this soil fruitful.

Please remember in your prayers:

- The Pope, Bishops and clergy: that they may reap a rich harvest of love and truth.
- Those who work on the land, that they may help the earth to produce a rich harvest so that no one goes hungry.
- Our parish community, that we may keep sowing seeds of prayer in our lives.
- The parishes of Keynsham and Whitchurch that they may grow in mission, communion and prayer
- Those who live with pain and suffering, that they may find strength, comfort and peace.
- Those who have died, that they may be received into the place of eternal happiness, where pain and suffering are no more.
