The Homily I put my keys in my pocket, when I remember to bring them with me! Most of my keys are metal, though some are electronic. The keys on the shoulders of Shebna the Master of the Palace in our first reading, would have been far too big for a pocket and made of wood. They were more like levers for moving a heavy bold. Not only were they practical, but they were also symbols of his office. This reading is also used in Advent in connection with the Great O Antiphon 'Key of David'. This master of the palace was not a butler or major domo; he was not a mere servant in the household. He was a grand vizier or prime minister,

able to stand in for his master.

This brings us neetly to Christ and Cirencester's own, dear St Peter. He and his fellow apostles are not servants but friends of Jesus Christ. To them all He will give the power of the keys, to bind and loose in earth and heaven. However, before He does that Christ apoints St Peter to a very special role, that of being his deputy on earth, the Vicar of Christ, symbolised by the keys of office.



This unique, Petrine Office, has been transmitted by the Prince of the Apostles to his successors as Bishops of Rome. Over the centuries the Bishops of Rome have borne many titles and some have been more preferred by one office holder or another. Patriarch of the West, Metropolitan of the Roman Province, Servant of the Servants of God. All of these come to the Bishop of Rome because he is Peter's Successor and Vicar of Christ.

Just as political prime ministers are supposed to serve the Queen and the people, so the Popes, our holy fathers, are to serve Christ and His people faithfully. Some have and some haven't but God never deserts his people and He always works through whoever we select as Pope, good or bad. May God bless our Holy Father, Pope Francis.
