Gospel Reflection

Last week, we heard St Peter being given a special office in the Christian Community. Immediately afterwards (in this week's gospel) Christ warns that His path to glory leads through suffering and death. For St Peter the same was true, being crucified upside down near the site of the Vatican. For all of us the path to heavenly glory leads through death. Most of us will encounter emotional, spiritual and physical suffering along the way, whether our own, or that of those close to us. We should not be surprised. The Saviour went the same way!!!

Apostles Creed

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there He will come and judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting. Amen.

Thought of the Week Our Third Eucharistic Prayer (written in the 1960s by Dom



Cyprian O Vaggagini OSB) is imbued with the spirit of the Roman Canon. Before the Consecration, it states that God the Father works through His Son Jesus Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit to do three very important and connected things, "so that from the rising of the Sun to its setting, a pure sacrifice may be offered to Your name." It is worth taking the time to pause and think about these three things, for they tell us about our daily lives.

1. God gives life to all things, including us. Christ came that we might have life and have in all its abundance. We are God's creatures and we live because He wills it. This speaks to the need to make sure all human beings have the basic necessities of life.
2. God makes us holy. This tells us that The Holy Trinity wants us to be pure like Himself. We are to live our lives in close proximity to God, getting closer every day. This also tells us that we need to change, because we are not entirely holy yet. Most of us think of ourselves as sinners, rather than saints but we are encouraged by the knowledge that God is working on changing that.
3. God never ceases to gather a people to Himself. This speaks to the mission of the Church. This gathering by God is done by us, His workers in the vineyard. As Bishop Declan likes to remind us, we are a people of mission, prayer and communion. Mass equips us for daily living in general but also specifically for mission and outreach. The very name Mass comes from the sending out at the end, "Ite Missa Est".

We intercede: -

- For the Pope, bishops and clergy, who carry the cross of pastoral care and responsibility.
- For those in government: that their choices and policies will always benefit those that they serve.
- For ourselves: that the fire of God's love may always burn in our hearts strengthening our faith.
- For the priests and people of Holy Rood, Swindon: that they may pursue prayer, communion and mission in equal measure.
- For all who daily bear the cross of suffering; that they may be held fast in God's right hand.
- For the dead in Christ
- , especially Mgr. William Mitchell, Noah, Fr Griffin, and Barbara Gardner: that their longing for God may be fulfilled in the sanctuary of heaven.
