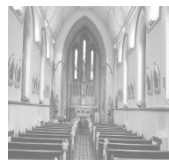
2nd Feb. The Presentation of the Lord, 40 days after Christmas

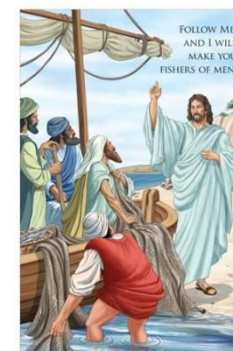

5. **All front line workers and carers, especially in our nursing homes and the NHS**

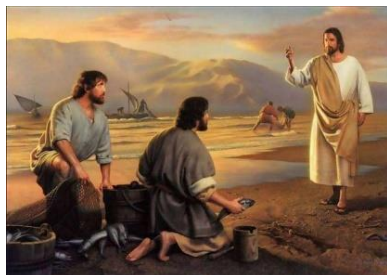

THE CRIB: By ancient English Tradition, the Crib will come down on Candlemas, 40 days after Christmas Day.

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK In the Good News According to Mark, Our Lord opens His preaching ministry with the words, "The time has come". St Paul (Galatians 4:4) says that the coming of the Son into our world is the fullness of time. Meeting Jesus now, in the moment of His choosing always requires a response from us, an Amen or a Thanks Be to God, an acceptance of His invitation to follow Him. This is not a Moment in the way that a clock measures

it, in seconds, minutes and hours. The Good News According to John talks about the entire events of the Passion and Resurrection as Jesus' Hour of Glory. Once again, when confronted with what Christ does for us, we must decide to accept or reject Him. Judas Iscariot and Peter both betray Him, but ultimately, one accepts and the other rejects the Lord. The Saviour's time, His Moment, is not just once in a lifetime, for He offers His opportunity and call every time Sacred Scripture is read and every time the Blessed Sacrament is presented to us. Despite their wobbles and weakness (and even mistakes), people in the Gospel stories keep responding positively to the Moment of Decision and Vocation, until they are ready to go out into the world and offer that Good News and Hour of Glory to men and women across the ages and across the world.

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 7:29-31

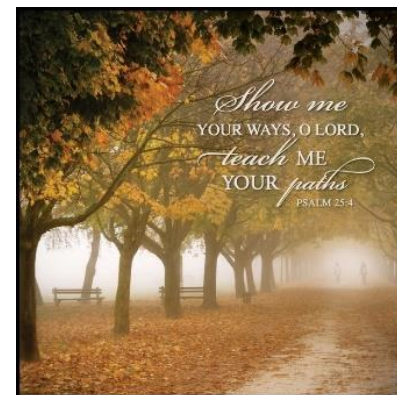
Gospel Acclamation Alleluia, Alleluia! The kingdom of God is close at hand: Repent, and believe the Good News. Alleluia!
